By having each class involved in the construction of the Outdoor Classroom and resources within it, we hope to provide some time and space for everyone to reflect and celebrate our amazing Kindergarten teacher. The Outdoor Classroom will be dedicated to her, ensuring her legacy and love of the outdoors will remain at the heart of Vernon River.
